In 2012, I won with 55.06% of the vote. The office of District Attorney is non-partisan, though I am a registered Democrat.

**7. How are you mentoring and/or supporting other women candidates since you've been elected?**

Throughout my professional and public service I have taken great pride in mentoring other women for leadership roles in volunteer and service roles. After I was elected I established a ride-along program in which I have invited high school and college girls to spend the day with me to expose them to the legal profession. So far 30+ girls and women have gone through this experience. Two women have now graduated from law school and one has passed the bar and become a lawyer. My youngest participant is 15-year old Paulina Martinez. She is a sophomore at South Gate High School. She lost her older sister to a drunk driver three years ago. I met her shortly thereafter and I continue to spend time with her to mentor her into college and eventually into law school. On my campaigns and in the District Attorney's Office, I have taken every opportunity to hire dynamic women on my staff. Fifty-five percent of the lawyers in my office are women. Seventy percent of my management team is made up of women. I am helped form and I am chairperson of the Women's Section of the National District Attorney's Association . I also am the founder and head of the Diversity Committee for the California District Attorney's Association. In addition, I have consistently mentored and supported women running for office in my community and across California.

**8. If this is your last term in your present position please tell us the name of the woman you are mentoring to succeed you.**

Though this will not be my last term in office, I have mentored numerous women in the District Attorney's office. As the first woman, and first African-American, to serve as L.A. County District Attorney since the office was created in 1850, I hope to see more women hold this seat in the future.
