Marcella “Marcy” De Veaux, PhD, is a full professor at California State University, Northridge. She is a depth psychologist, an educator and diversity consultant. De Veaux holds a doctorate in Depth Psychology and Liberation Psychology from Pacifica Graduate Institute She also earned a master’s degree in Human Resource Management from Lesley College, in Cambridge, Massachusetts; both degrees support her work in grappling with unconscious bias in the workplace.

Currently, De Veaux conducts workshops on anti-racism, diversity, equity, inclusion, and cultural competency for faculty, staff and students in higher education. In addition, her workshops for businesses, non-profit organizations and media companies address divisions of race, class and gender, to support and encourage the development of culturally competent and equitable work environments.
